FROM THE DIRECTOR

Engineering and Construction Department Update

The Bryant Engineering & Construction Department is actively engaged with the growth and development of the City of Bryant.

This has been a very busy summer for our department as we also have adapted and restructured our workdays to accommodate safety concerns for COVID-19. Currently, our construction managers, who include: Joe Henry, Scott Chandler, and Daran Robertson have mobile offices primarily located in their city vehicles where they remain out of the field most of the work hours they are on duty.

Currently, the Department is observing and inspecting a medium to large (\$750,000) Wastewater Distribution Rehabilitation project in the area from Debswood to the east side of Mills Park Road. The list of numerous commercial projects that are under construction observation includes The Arkansas Heart Hospital, a Commercial Warehouse Project, and a new Hotel. Currently, we are also reviewing four (4) new proposed Subdivisions with a potential of 240 lots/houses to be added to the city.

There are also various Stormwater Drainage Improvement projects at various stages of design and construction around the City with target areas of Debswood & Raintree, Springhill & Hilltop, Cambridge, etc. Other areas are also receiving focus for stormwater improvements.

The Department is also in various stages of the Design and Construction of City-sponsored Parks Projects. Some of those include possible Ashley and Alcoa 40 Park Bathrooms, a new Bishop Park Festival Pavilion, and the Alcoa 40 Multi-use Trail. We are anticipating to review the 60% design plans of the Bryant Parkway Phase 2 (Shobe Road to Reynolds) as submitted by consultant Garver Engineering by the end of July. We will continue to update the community as these projects near completion and encourage you to remain actively involved in the continued smart growth of our city.

Dear Bryant Community,

We know that there is one question on the minds of our district's parents, students, employees, and community members: What will education at Bryant Public Schools look like when the doors open on August 24?

We have been working collaboratively for months now to answer that exact question and share our plans to reopen school. Families were offered the choice of two learning models: Blended (Onsite) or Virtual (Online). The survey opened for the last time on July 23 and closed at midnight July 27. For the 20-21 school year approximately 27% of our students have chosen virtual learning.

Those returning to school campuses will find enhanced measures which focus on safety first and foremost. Each student and staff member will be expected to wear a mask; social distancing will be the norm. Decisions that foster the overall health of students, staff and our community rely on the most current Arkansas Department of Health (ADH) guidance. Guidance from ADH and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education is updated frequently.

We continue to monitor and adjust as needed. We remain flexible while focused on ensuring our students continue to get the best education possible in a manner that keeps them, their families, and our employees safe. To learn more, visit bryantschools.org for information on our Ready
