I'm happy to announce that the last new construction projects has been completed. We celebrated the first games in the Hornet Arena on January 7. The sense of pride felt by the players and coaches on the court was echoed in the stands by fans.

Bryant Schools is very fortunate to be part of a community that generously supports education. The 2017 millage helped fund the construction of Parkway Elementary, Bryant Junior High, Bryant High School Cafeteria, Transportation/Maintenance/Technology Building, Fine Arts Center, and Hornet Arena. These facilities provided not only much needed space, but also improved the overall site plan at the high school by closing in the campus and improving safety.

Our community will also benefit from the new facilities. Bryant Junior High is the location for the annual Greater Bryant Chamber of Commerce Winter Banquet, where over 500 members will enjoy an evening of entertainment and ceremony. On March 4-7, the district will host the 6A Girls and Boys State Basketball Tournament in Hornet Arena, the first time we have had the facilities needed for an event of this size. We will be proud to welcome guests from all over the state and provide an economic boost to our local economy.

The final facility project will be a partial renovation of Hornet Stadium, which will be completed in August 2020. We'll be adding a new ticket booth and concession area, as well as sidewalks to make the stadium more accessible to fans with disabilities. Additional seating will also be part of the project.
