It seems that 2020 has brought a lot of change and challenge to each of us, and your city departments are not excluded from that. In the midst of this current pandemic, we found ourselves here at the Bryant Fire Department, needing to replace several positions. Normally, this process is simple once we have identified our candidates. We hire and send them to training. However, due to the precautions and restrictions put in place for the health and safety of all involved, the Arkansas Fire Training Academy (AFTA) placed a halt on all onsite fire training. So, like many of you have had to, we adapted and came up with a plan that would move these new hires on in the training process.

Fortunately, with the recent addition of our own fire training facility located at Station 2 at Hill Farm, we were able to gain approval to provide the training, onsite here in Bryant ourselves.

This meant we were able to continue bringing these five newly hired personnel on board, without interruption. Five were hired, two were already certified and three needed still needed to complete initial firefighter training. Firefighters Andrew Etherington, Jordan Brown, and Jordan Pruitt all received their training here. Firefighter Jakob Dever went through the training as well.


