The Bryant Water Department has been making the most out of their recently acquired Pipe Bursting Machine. The new machinery has enabled the city to complete projects in-house, versus hiring contractors, allowing the water department to control costs to our residents as well as complete projects. Ted Taylor, city engineer adds, "Having access to this type of equipment assists the city in meeting several of the requirements located within the ADEQ consent action order at significant savings to our citizens".

Since August, the water department has completed (5) five major replacement projects, three in the Justice Loop area and two along with Henson place.

Kindergarten Registration

Bryant Public Schools will hold online Kindergarten Registration on March 9, 10 and 11. A child must be five years of age on or before August 1 and live in the Bryant School District in order to be eligible to enroll in kindergarten. Visit bryantschools.org for a list of documents needed for enrollment and a link to registration.

Pre-K Registration

Bryant Pre-K Registration will be held March 16-17. A child must be four years on or before August 1 and live in the Bryant School District to be eligible to attend.

Program is offered FREE to Bryant residents, picks up weekly, each Tuesday. Approved items for pick up are as follows: shrubs, rootballs with no dirt, branches, and trees cut less than 6 ft long, along with leaves and grass trimmings bagged in paper bags.

We cannot pick up: treated lumber, treated wood, rocks or synthetic mulch.
