PAVILION

Great volunteers make great communities and the City of Bryant is always pleased to see the volunteer efforts that occur throughout our community. This time, thanks to an idea originating from one of our city volunteers, Bryant City Hall and its visitors are on the receiving end of one of those efforts.

Zach Milam, Bryant City Hall volunteer and Eagle Scout candidate, proposed that his scout group build a pavilion behind the Dean Boswell Municipal Complex located next to Ashley Park. His troop leaders supported the idea and practically overnight Zach and other volunteers from Boy Scout Troop 17 had a beautiful new pavilion up for all to enjoy. Going the extra mile the troop also pressure washed the existing picnic tables at Ashley Park resulting in a remarkable difference in their appearance.

MASTER GARDNERS

Thanks to a group of volunteers from Saline County Master Gardeners one of the entrances to Bryant City Hall received a much needed face lift recently. This group of volunteers give a minimum of 40 hours per person back to their community every year. This project is only one of many within the city, and their commitment to keeping Bryant beautiful is appreciated by all!

DISC GOLF

Volunteers are the driving force behind many of our projects in the Bryant Parks Department. Thanks to a key group of individuals and their community service, Bishop Park has a beautiful 18- hole disc golf course, The Traxx @ Bishop Park.

Creators Preston Cowen and Robbie Shaw were the driving forces to encourage members in the community to help build this course, in an effort to grow the sport of Disc Golf. The project started in October 2016 and The Traxx saw their grand opening a year later. Over 1200 volunteer hours is what it took, to make the Traxx a reality.

MILLS PARK BIKE TRAILS

There have been over 2 miles of trails added to the trail system at Mills Park over the past year thanks to a dedicated group of volunteers. Bryant resident, Jay Lasey along with others who are active in the biking community, have created an off road trail system that cyclist of any age can enjoy. From clearing pathways to adding bridges, over 600 man hours have been given to this project with plans to add another .6 miles over the next month.
