



ON THE BALLOT CITY COUNCIL TERMS

On November 6, 2018, Citizens to vote on changing the "terms of office" for City Council members serving the four wards of Bryant. Your vote will decide to stay with the current two-year term of service or to go to a staggered, four-year term of service.

If approved by Bryant voters, the new term of service will be enacted as follows: City Council members representing position number one from each ward will be elected to a four-year term at the next general election. City council members representing position number two from each ward will be elected to a two-year term at the next election, and thereafter will be elected to four-year terms, resulting in staggered terms with one (1) City Council Member being elected to a four-year term from each ward every two (2) years.

UPDATE ON BRYANT PARKWAY

PHASE 1: Connecting I-30 to Shobe Road

Engineering complete, construction underway and things are taking shape.

PHASE 2: From Alcoa 40 Park at S. Shobe Rd. to Hill Farm Rd.

This phase has required coordination with officials from City, County, School, Union Pacific, and Federal Aviation involving many variables including environmental factors. Several alternative routes were fully vetted and Garver Engineering presented "Alternative B" route as the best option as it meets all principal objectives. Other advantages of this route include: no loss of property or impacts to houses/yards, most direct/shortest route, lowest cost, more connectivity options & access for neighborhoods to trails/schools, increase in property values, fits existing infrastructure, meets majority of stakeholder requirements/objectives, and keeps noise at a minimum due to 35 mph speed limit.

Mayor Dabbs stated "As Bryant grows at a rapid rate, so will the need to provide cohesive connectivity throughout the city. In 2016 Voters approved a bond reissuance with a 72% approval rate. This was a mandate to build Bryant Parkway. Our engineers are diligently working on the design and route to ensure we meet objectives while staying on budget as much as possible. We have already reduced projected budget overage from \$10 million down to \$3 million. I am confident we will continue to make rapid progress toward the completion of Bryant Parkway. This project is currently on schedule and I anticipate it will remain on schedule."
